
NEED HOLIDAYS READING? You can check out these Books or other ones written by Fr. Peter Vu in the back of church. Happy reading!



The Book "Inspiration Coffee and Wisdom Tea for a Hectic Day" is a self-help book to give you the tools and daily exercises that can create the right condition for your body and spirit to restore itself with the divine help and deal with your mental health. As you go through your daily routine of relying on the external stimulants to get you through your day, just imagine how much more your spirit might need encouragement to stay focused and get inspired each day. That is how I have come up with the idea of having two sayings each day for this book. One is to inspire you like

coffee or latte in the morning, while another is like tea giving you wisdom to help you face your "hectic day" with confidence. I assign each day with two sayings: one in the morning from various inspiring sources and the other in the afternoon from mainly the Bible as the ultimate source of wisdom. I also label the interpretation of the inspiration saying as "Inspiring Morning Mojo" to give you the energy boost as the coffee or latte would to do to you. Meanwhile, I label the interpretation of the wisdom of God, God's Whisper, Voice of an Angel, Advice of a Counselor, Words of Encouragement, Reassuring Spirit, and Good Karma. That way you can feel the collective wisdom as you sip a cup of tea every afternoon.

As Catholics, we have several feasts (and titles!) that honor Our Lady throughout the year. Throughout the Advent and Christmas season, however, she is mentioned and honored in the church's liturgy:

December 8th- Immaculate Conception

December 12th- Our Lady of Guadalupe, 4th Sunday of Advent readings

Today's solemnity recognizes her under the title of Mary, Mother of God. She is an important figure in salvation history and she can be, if we let her, an important part of our own spiritual lives as well.

Sadly, there is much confusion and sometimes even a shroud of suspicion surrounding Mary's role in Christianity. Though much dialogue has been made between Catholics, Mary remains a stumbling block for many non-Catholic Christians. In my opinion, most of the objections I hear stem from misunderstanding of Catholic belief. Even some Catholics have difficulty understanding or believing in the Immaculate Conception or her perpetual virginity. Today, as both a Marian feast day and New Year's Day, is a great day to make a resolution to grow deeper in our understanding of Mary. It is a great time to seek to understand any personally difficult teachings that confuses or even upsets us. God responds to our seeking and our struggle. I'd love to suggest an episode of one of my favorite podcasts, Pints with Aquinas, called *EVERY* Objection to Mary Answered. It came up as I was looking for inspiration to write my bulletin article, so I'm passing this inspiration on to you! If this isn't your cup of tea, there are numerous other sources. Check out the CDs and books about Mary in the Narthex (the gathering area) and I'm happy to share more resources as well! May God bless you this year and always!!
