The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A



It is true that life is a good, beautiful gift, but it also can be complicated, confusing, and burdensome. The same world in which we can view the wonder of a mountain vista, feel the touch of a newborn's hand, or witness an act of selfless charity is also the same world in which we suffer natural disaster, mourn the death of our loved ones, and experience abuse at the hands of others.

Even when life is going well there are many things, good things, that demand out attention. Many of us are exhausted or depleted, just making it through each day. Sometimes the intense suffering from around the world that we hear about can depress or overwhelm us, or a personal, deep pain can immobilize us. Life can feel like a very heavy cloak at times. If we are too inwardly focused on our own lives, we ignore or never notice the pain of others; if we hyper-focus on the world's problems we become cynical; if we only focus on our own pain, we become depressed.

Instead, the Lord shows us a more abundant way of life: release those bound unjustly, set free the oppressed, share bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, care for your family. (par. Is. 58:6-7) We must also remove *the accusing finger and malicious speech* from ourselves (Is 58:9b). In doing this, *Then the light shall rise for you in the darkness and the gloom shall become for you like midday* (Is. 58:10) and *your wound shall be quickly healed* (Is. 58:8)This may have been written about the nation of Israel, but it is absolutely essential to our Christian lives. Christian service is both a cause *and* effect of Christian joy.

If you are feeling stuck in any way, especially pain or a stagnant spiritual life, commit to small acts of service. Seek out ways to feed the poor or assist those in need. Opportunities to do so present themselves to us every day. Ask the Lord to open your eyes to them. Step into a new ministry. Curb your anger and mind your speech. *Then the LORD will guide you always and satisfy your thirst in parched places, will give strength to your bones And you shall be like a watered garden, like a flowing spring whose waters never fail.* (Is 58:11)

Saturday, January 28th, we had our monthly Feeding American food truck. We distributed food to 178 families, which includes 721 individuals, 143 seniors, 311 children, and 15 veterans. Thank you to all of the volunteers that came out on a very cold, but beautiful morning. Hello everyone,

This coming Saturday, Feb. 11th, we will celebrate the feast of our Lady of Lourdes which is also the World Day of the Sick. On this special day, Pope Francis' message focuses on the theme: *"Take care of him"* taken from the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk 10:35). He encourages us to learn from our loving Jesus to accompany the sick with closeness, compassion, and tenderness.

"Take care of him" is the request of the Samaritan to the innkeeper. Usually, our perception for the Samaritan is the one who renders care and compassion to the victim. The innkeeper gets involved in it as well. After performing the needed treatment to the stranger, the Samaritan carries the victim on his horse back to a close inn. He asks the innkeeper to continue to take care of him. Jesus as the good Shepherd always wishes to cure his sheep physically, mentally, and spiritually. Jesus invites all of us to extend his care as we visit, care and encourage our vulnerable brothers and sisters.

Reflecting on the parable of the Good Samaritan, the Pope reminds us of the reality of loneliness and abandonment. These conditions happen when we fail to pay attention to the needy. Only when we are sick, ill or weak, do we truly appreciate a phone call, a get-well card, a prayer for healing or a word of encouragement. Indeed, few minutes of care can bring a difference to others and make them feel cared for and supported.

Let us keep in our prayers all our brothers and sisters who are sick, especially those in our prayer list. We also pray for all caregivers; may God increase their love and zeal to serve with heartfelt compassion.


