Christian Services

How your contributions support Christian Services:

- Helping those who have difficulty putting food on the table every day. We sponsor a Feeding America food truck every month. Over the past year we averaged 147 families per month.
- Offering Coffee & Donuts after the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.
- When a loved one passes away there is nothing better than a good home cooked meal, which is what we offer the family. For families that are unable to meet the cost of the luncheon, the parish can absorb it.
- The church has 5 different seasons, Ordinary time, Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. With each of these seasons we change the décor. We purchase the flowers and other decorations with the memorial donations you give at Christmas and Easter.
- During the holidays it can be hard for some families to be able to put a nice meal on the table. We help by giving them a holiday basket with all the trimmings using the groceries that you donate as well at the meat and produce we purchase.
- We receive names of students needing help from Kentwood Public School s. Those names are put on the Giving Tree and you have an opportunity to purchase a gift. We also support several agencies asking for specific items, like gloves and travel size toiletries.
- Every year around the feast of St Mary Magdalen we celebrate with a festival. In years past it has been a 3 day event, but with the current circumstances we have cut it down to 1 day. This is a time we want to come together and celebrate who we are as a parish community. Your contributions help purchase the food and entertainment we provide. Our goal is to break even on costs and have a good time.
- With such an active parish, it takes a lot of volunteers to make things happen and every year we like to say 'thank you' to everyone who has helped in any way by inviting them a nice appreciation dinner.

Music Ministry

The use of funds for the music program this year has mainly fallen under the following three categories:

<u>Maintenance</u>: An organ or piano must be tuned regularly to keep the instrument in good, working condition. We have 3 pianos (sanctuary, chapel, practice room) and an organ we maintain. In addition, we had the sound engineer come out when there were problems with the system.

Music purchases: This includes music for the liturgy. COVID changed the makeup of a lot of choirs, including ours. I have had to add music to our library that reflects the voicing of our choir (mainly Soprano and Altos; baritone instead of bass and tenor). We also pay a copyright licensing fee to project the words to the songs on the TV. In an effort to save money and time, I search for public domain arrangements, hymns, or arrange a song myself. I have purchased a number of more contemporary Catholic songs and psalms (written from the early 2000's to now) to help update our repertoire as well.

<u>Musician fees</u>: This year I hired a cellist at Easter and a trumpeter for Christmas. I would love to invite more musicians in the future (or have more volunteers from the parish!).
