Music Ministry

During Lent, there are several changes to our liturgy and liturgical space. If you are a parent to children in the home, this is a great time to ask you child about what they noticed during Mass to open up to a greater conversation about the "why" of Lent. Here are some starting points:

- **Environment:** flowers are removed and decorations are sparse.
- **Vestments:** Green Ordinary Time stoles and linens are replaced with purple ones.
- Music: We replace the Gospel "Alleluia" with the Gospel Acclamation. We will not sing "Alleluia" until the Easter Vigil. Music takes on a more somber tone.
- **St.Mary Magdalen traditions:** We sing the *Kyrie*, we chant the *Agnus Dei* in Latin, & chant is played before and after Mass to promote personal prayer at these times.

Music is a powerful way to integrate the liturgical life with our home lives. I think it's important and can benefit everyone, but I think it's particularly helpful for people who may be struggling with prayer and busy parents of young children. Here are some songs from early Gregorian chant through contemporary Christian music:

- *O Crux Ave- Morales
- *St. Matthew Passion (BWV 244)- Bach
- *Calvary- Mahalia Jackson
- *Amazing Grace- various artists

- *Wood and Nails- Porter's Gate
- *Run to the Father- Matt Maher

Homebound Ministry

Hello everyone,

Station of the Cross is the great devotion of Holy Lent. This spiritual prayer draws us closer to our Lord Jesus, to follow Him on His journey to Calvary, to see how much He loved us and died for us. As we enter this Holy season, let us review a little of its history.

The station of the Cross began in the late 4th century when the faithful went to Holy Land to visit the Church of the Holy Sepulcher which was built in 335 AD atop Calvary and the Tomb of Jesus. During the Holy Week, people pray and process from the Garden of Gethsemane to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

The station of the Cross developed more after 1342 when the Franciscan friars took care of the holy sites in the Holy Land. The church granted indulgences for those praying at some particular stations relating to the Passion of Jesus.

When the faithful could not go to Holy Land due to Moslem oppression, in 1686, Pope Innocent XI permitted the Franciscan to erect the stations in their churches and to receive the indulgences through praying this devotion. In 1742, Pope Benedict XIV encouraged all priests to enrich their churches with the Way of the Cross with 14 stations as we see now in many churches.

Whenever we pray the Way of the Cross to meditate on the passion and death of our Lord, we receive a plenary indulgence. May we continue this beautiful devotion to follow our Lord closer and learn to love and sacrifice like Him.


