

Dear Friends in Christ,

God invites each one of us to a loving relationship with Him. During the holy season of Lent, we focus in an intentional way on turning away from sin and toward God to grow in this relationship. The Lenten pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving help us do this. A simple way to practice these pillars is through the Catholic Relief Services' (CRS) Rice Bowl program. This small cardboard box holds many opportunities.

Participating in the Rice Bowl program enables young Catholics to see how small change can add up to become a worthy gift. It provides families the opportunity to create meals from countries whose people benefit from Catholic Relief Services' programs. It provides all of us with an opportunity to reflect on the needs of our sisters and brothers and how we can respond in love. But most importantly, with the support of families like yours, other families will receive an opportunity to reach their God-given potential when they receive the nutritious food needed to thrive.

The Rice Bowl program also has a local impact. Twenty-five percent of contributions collected through the program remain here in our diocese. Last year's CRS Rice Bowl contributions helped four local organizations receive funding for food and poverty alleviation programs, including St. Ann's Bread of Life Food Pantry in Baldwin, Community Food Club of Grand Rapids, the St. Gianna Baby Pantry in Muskegon through Catholic Charities West Michigan, and St. Mary's Caritas Food Pantry in Custer.

The COVID-19 pandemic has adversely affected the financial situation of many. Thank you for your Lenten sacrifices that allow CRS Rice Bowl to reach people in need. Visit crsricebowl.org to find out more. Together, we can respond to Christ's call to help those in need of food and nutrition.

#### **Homebound Ministry**

Hello everyone,

Very soon, we will enter the holy season of Lent, initiating with Ash Wednesday. During this time of grace and of renewing our relationship with God, the church liturgy repeatedly reminds us not to receive God's grace in vain: "Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" 2 Cor 6: 2. The Lenten season lasts 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday not including Sundays. Why does Lent last for 40 days? The number 40 has a special meaning in the Bible. Let us explore this to live this holy season to the fullest.

The number 40 symbolizes a period of testing and trials. Through the Bible, we see:

- 1. The 40-day deluge: "And the rain fell upon the earth for forty days and forty nights. (Gen. 7:12).
- 2. Moses lived 40 years in the desert after killing the Egyptians (Acts 7:30).
- 3. Moses was on Mount Sinai for 40 days and 40 nights (Exod 24:18).
- 4. Moses interceded on Israel's behalf for 40 days and 40 nights (Deut 9:18, 25).
- 5. The Israelites went to spy on Canaan for 40 days (Num 13:25).
- 6. The Jews wandered in the desert for 40 years (Deut 8:2-5).
- 7. It took 40 days for Elijah to go to Mount Horeb without food or water. (1 Kgs 19:8).
- 8. Lastly, number 40 reminds us of the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert fasting and praying and to be tempted by Satan before going out for the mission (Matt 4:1-11). May we earnestly enter this season of grace to refresh our relationship with God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

The blessed ashes, the rite and prayer cards will be available in the back of the Church on Ash Wednesday March 2<sup>nd</sup>. You are welcome to take them to the homebound and loved ones. After distributing ashes, the leftover blessed ashes should be respectfully buried in the ground.

When we **fast**, we experience a little bit of the hunger that many experience daily. We make room for the needs of others—and room for God's Holy Spirit to work within us.

Finally, through a recognition of the world's needs and a personal commitment to help others, we give **alms**.

This year, with these pillars as our guide, CRS Rice Bowl will introduce us to our neighbors in Guatemala, Bangladesh and Rwanda. We'll learn how the dreams of our sisters and brothers are inspiring them to overcome challenges that impact their daily life. To dream bigger. To help their families and communities succeed.

Changes around the Corner during Lent:

As you know, our liturgical worship reflects the liturgical season in which we are. The penitential season of Lent puts away our more celebratory parts such as the *Gloria* and the *Alleluia*. We will highlight this penitential season by singing a longer version of the *Kyrie* as well as replacing the sung English "Lamb of God" with the Latin missal chant (*Agnus Dei*). Music will be more subdued and the tradition at this parish is to replace the recessional hymn with a hand bell. You may stay to pray or leave after Father is at the back of church. There are no preludes during Lent, but we will play a Gregorian chant CD before Mass.

Additionally, I have been hoping to change the "Mass setting," or "Ordinary," which is the collection the people's parts we sing at Mass each week. We have been using the current setting for a *long* time, mainly due to keeping things simple and familiar during the pandemic. We are still in a pandemic, but I think we could all use a change of music! I have been reviewing settings for a few weeks and we will be introducing one in March. Stay tuned!

I invite those who are interested in singing for Easter to attend rehearsal THIS THURSDAY, MARCH 3<sup>rd</sup> AT 7:15pm. Our choir does a fabulous job as it is, but they would appreciate the support of new voices. Feel free to show up or email me ahead of time. Easter is only a few short weeks away.

Hello everyone!

I am so excited to have been on retreat with our middle school and high school students this week! I realized once again just how much I missed it last year, and I'm so glad that we were able to once again put on this great event for the youth of the parish. Keep an eye out next week for pictures of our weekend together, and thank you for sending your students on retreat!

In a conversation with a friend this past week, a quote came up about the cycle of human history. We were talking about the ways in which humans can feel lost, purposeless, or generally adrift. This is the quote that came to mind, which I shared with my friend: "Hard times create strong men. Strong men create good times. Good times create weak men. Weak men create hard times."

I think that this quote works exceptionally well with our first reading today, which talks about the relationship between hardship and a show of character. As in the quote, our best, true selves cannot be determined when times are easy. Rather, it is in the difficult times—the shaking of the sieve, the fire of the potter's furnace—that we are put to the test. It is easy for us to put our best foot forward when things are going well for us, but much harder to show that same character when things aren't going well. Our true test of character, as shown in Sirach, is the moment when things are going wrong but we choose the path of righteousness anyway.

"Praise no one before he speaks," this first reading warns, "for it is then that people are tested." The moment we decide to act, especially in a time of tribulation, we are faced with the opportunity to present our true selves to the world. How can we seize that opportunity and ensure that our best selves and true selves are one and the same? Peace,

In reading one of the guides, I came across this paragraph that might help you better understand what is being asked of us as participants in the Synod;

Pope Francis is asking each local diocese to gather together-clergy, religious and laity- to first listen to each other's joys and hopes, and griefs and anxieties (c.f. Gaudium et Spes no. 1). After we listen to each other, we are called to dialogue together on ways we can accompany each other as we seek to grow in holiness. Listening and speaking within the Church always involves prayer. We are listening, dialoguing, and praying together so that we can hear the voice of the Holy Spirit. The "goal" of this journeying together is not to create a new vision or pastoral plan with objectives. Rather, the goal of our journeying together is to be present with one another, to listen and learn with each other, and to grow closer to the Lord and His Church.
