

Music Ministry

He saved us and called us to a holy life... (2 Timothy 1:9a)

Of all the readings for this Sunday, this is what jumped out at me personally the most.

This is the "why" to a lot of questions we all have.

I hope to present my children with a very different world view and moral compass than the world offers. As my children have grown up, they continue to be exposed to the wider world around them. Sometimes what they are exposed to doesn't line up with our Catholic faith. As a result, I take the opportunity to have a pretty matter-of-fact conversation about what we believe. One child in particular will always immediately ask, "why?" Sometimes it flusters me because I don't always feel prepared to dig deeper. At this point I either do my best to explain the reason for our belief, or I tell them I would like to understand better myself and will share with them when I learn more.

When this verse jumped out at me, my mind immediately went back to a conversation with my children this weekend. Even though the teaching made sense to me, I stumbled over my answer to my child, and even I wasn't satisfied with my own explanation. Although I think it's important to share our faith in a wellreasoned manner and not simply an "I said so," I realize that the rules and most disciplines we have as Christians can be boiled down to 1) "he saved us and called us to a holy life" and 2) because he asks this of us. We must know our faith, but our knowledge must be anchored in the love of God from which comes the desire to do what he asks. In our weaknesses as humans we may slip away from that which our faith teaches. In essence, we ask ourselves, "Why not?" The answer is "because he saved us and called us to a holy life." What beautiful simplicity. We don't have to be armchair theologians. We simply live as he asked.

This lent is a time to re-orient ourselves toward holiness. Let us through the liturgy, through Scripture and the Eucharist, in prayer and song be buoyed up in this earthly journey towards heaven where we will finally all be "holy as God is holy."

We gave food to a record number of families 196 consisting of 358 children, 148 seniors, and 17 veterans totaling 807 individuals. This monthly distribution is made possible through your generous weekly donation and a bunch of dedicated volunteers.
We are encouraged to pray the Stations of the Cross frequently at any time throughout the year to meditate on Christ's Passion. It is popular that we pray this devotion on Fridays during Lent, especially on Good Friday. To me, I choose to deepen my prayer life by meditating one station each day of Lent.
