## **Music Ministry**

Sometimes it is a struggle to find the right music for Mass. Sometimes it seems like there isn't a good fit for a specific Sunday. Sometimes, everything falls into place without much effort. Planning music for this weekend fell into the latter category.

There is a lot of symbolism and even more kernels of knowledge and wisdom available to us in this Sunday's scriptures. For instance, I loved Moses' cry out to God: "What shall I do with this people? A little more and they will stone me!" Goodness. I will bet most of us have had points in our life when we are doing what we think God wants us to do but hardship after hardship develops. We throw our hands up in frustration and look to God and say, "*Really, God?!*" Moses gives us a model to bring this all to God, including our fear, frustration, or whatever we may be feeling at that moment.

I also love what is going on in the gospel, the astonishment of the disciples, when they returned to see Jesus speaking with a Samaritan woman, should not be lost on us. Christ chose to reveal himself to someone on the outskirts of society. Like the story of the Magi that came and worshipped the child Jesus, this story shows that Christ's salvation is to be for all peoples.

There are many more beautiful things to pull from these readings, but the main theme we see repeated is thirst and water. I had ideas for songs popping in my head before I opened the hymnal. Our entrance hymn *I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say* is one of my favorite hymns. I love the melody and the chords that progress from minor to major along with the words of Jesus and our response to him. It's just a song that has an effect on my heart each time I play it. It was perfect for the readings today.

I also chose "O God, You Search Me" which is a paraphrase of psalm 139 to reflect on another aspect of the Gospel reading: that God *knows* us. He knows everything about us and he loves us and works all things for our good. The offertory hymn is a beautiful reminder of this truth.



Longer term capital campaign projects:


- 1) Resurfacing and restriping the Church Parking Lot

#### Hello everyone,

We are halfway with Jesus in this Lenten journey. I hope this sacred time has strengthened you, enriched your spiritual life and brought you closer to God. As I reflect on the Lenten message of Pope Francis, I would like to focus on a highlight of it: "Lenten Penance and the Synodal Journey".

Based on the Scripture passage of the transfiguration of Jesus on mount Tabor, Pope Francis addresses the relation between Lenten penance and the Synodal journey. Both matters aimed at the transformation in each of us and in the Church. Indeed, together with the Church, during Lent, we are called to go up to the high mountain with Jesus to practice spiritual discipline to obtain the conversion of heart.

The Holy Father suggests two ways as Lenten's observance to help us achieve this goal: listening to Jesus and living his passion and cross. We listen to Jesus in his Holy Word, in our brothers and sisters. The daily Scripture readings and meditation aid us to know his teachings. We follow Jesus in his passion to draw strength and courage to deal with our own crosses and struggles.

May this Lenten season continue nurturing our spiritual life and transforming us to become more humble, obedient but also courageous like Jesus.
