

Dear Friends in Christ,

We watched in disbelief this summer as Afghans, desperate to leave their country, clung to a plane as it left the runway. Afghan citizens left behind face a dire situation. According to Catholic Relief Services (CRS), more than half the country's citizens are now facing acute food insecurity. According to the United Nations, if no action is taken, more than 100,000 children could die of starvation.

Catholic Relief Services is in Afghanistan helping its people combat food insecurity, access education, and build a better life. Next weekend, **March 26-27**, we have a great opportunity to support CRS' work in Afghanistan and in more than 100 other countries through the annual CRS Collection taking place in our parishes.

This collection is the main source of funding for six important Church-related agencies — Catholic Relief Services; the USCCB Offices of International Justice and Peace, Migration and Refugee Services, and Pastoral Care for Migrants and Refugees; the relief work of the Holy Father; and the Catholic Legal Immigration Network.

Hello everyone,

In the quiet and penitential atmosphere of the Lenten season, the Church invites us to joyfully celebrate the solemnity of Saint Joseph and the Annunciation which fall on the 19th and 25th of March. These feast days surround a theme: *Fiat!*

The church reserves the whole month of March to honor Saint Joseph. His feast day on the 19th seems to be the peak of the month. Saint Joseph is a silent and obedient man. In the Bible, we don't hear a word uttering from his mouth. Through the message of the angel of God, he only acts to fulfill God's will and plan so that we can say: actions speak louder than words.

The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates the incarnation of our Savior and of Mary's willingness to accept God's will. It links to Christmas when celebrating 9 months before this event. It highlights the significant *FIAT*- the obedience of Mary when she says "yes" to the invitation to conceive Jesus in her womb.

In this spirit, the *Fiat* of Mary and Joseph is preceded by the *FIAT* of Jesus. He seeks to please God the Father by fulfilling his will. Jesus agrees to come down to earth and to be incarnated in the womb of Mary. Ultimately, He says the greater *FIAT* to the chalice of death to obtain salvation for humankind.

May we follow the example of Jesus, Mary and Joseph to trust in God's holy will, that we might join Jesus to say: "Not my will but yours be done". (Luke 22: 42)




