



#### **Homebound Ministry**

Hello everyone,

We are at the climax of the Lenten season, which is the Holy Week beginning with Psalm Sunday. The liturgy of this Holy Week and the Holy Tridium celebrates the Lord Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection to bring salvation to humankind. Attending these significant liturgical services allows us to understand the sacrificial love of our God for us so that in return, we would respond with love and profound gratitude. In that spirit, I would like to highlight some main points of this Holy Week:

Palm Sunday: The Church commemorates the triumphal entry of Jesus into the temple. Holding palm leaves in hand, we follow Jesus' footsteps to enter Jerusalem to die for ourselves so that we may live with Him in his resurrection. The blessed Palms and the olive branches are kept in the home as a witness to our faith in Jesus Christ and in his Paschal Victory.

Holy Thursday: We celebrate the Last Supper of Jesus with two events: Feet washing and the Institution of the Eucharist. The priest will repeat the same action as Jesus by washing people's feet. Through this humble act, Jesus left us a lesson of serving each other. To honor the Eucharist and to be with Jesus on that very night in the garden of Gethsemane, we wake with Him through silent adoration.

Good Friday: We commemorate the death of Jesus through the solemn Stations of the Cross. This day is a day of fasting and abstinence to honor the suffering death of Jesus for our sins. There will be no Mass but a liturgy which includes 10 intercessions for all people in the world.

Holy Saturday: We keep waiting with the sorrowful Mother. There will be no Mass until the Easter Vigil. It is the most solemn and significant of moments which celebrates the new life of the Risen Christ, Jesus vanquished death and rose in glory. The priest blesses a new fire and lights the Easter Candle. In this long and grandiose Vigil liturgy, we will listen to beautiful readings that summarize the history of salvation.

Let us ask for the grace of walking closer with Jesus and experience in a deeper way His love for each of us through all these beautiful celebrations. Wishing you all a very blessed and Holy Week.

Hello everyone,

Welcome to Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday! I hope that everyone has been doing well in the Lenten season and that you have all been able to grow in faith as we head toward Easter. While this week is definitely a busy one for the church today, it would have also been a busy week in Jesus's time as well, full of preparation for the Passover celebration.

What strikes me most about Palm Sunday is the dichotomy of our two Gospel readings. How is it that within a week Jesus goes from a man celebrated, treated like the King he is, to a man crucified? Where are the crowds who herald him into the city when it comes time for him to be judged by Pilate? Why does no one show up? The space between the events of Palm Sunday and Good Friday is so small, and the change in public opinion when it comes to Jesus seems too rapid.

Yet, I wonder if that's really so surprising. How often do our moods change throughout the course of a day or week? Has something minor ever changed the way you felt about a person or thing? I think it happens more than we'd like to admit, and the Palm Sunday readings put our tendency to let our emotions rule us at front and center. In participating in the Passion reading, we are made to confront these more uncomfortable parts of being human: our tendency toward mob mentality and our inability to understand long-term consequences when we're being swayed by strong emotion. How can we keep more evenkeeled in our lives and show restraint in our decision making?

#### **Faith Formation**

\*I have addressed this article towards the children of the parish, but it really is a question we can all ask of ourselves.

Hello Kids.

The Scripture readings this week have given me a lot to think about. What did you think when you heard about how the people laid down their cloaks for Jesus as he rode toward Jerusalem? Can you imagine all of those people praising Jesus as the "King", the "one who comes in the name of the Lord"? What a powerful picture. It is hard to believe that only a short time later, some of them would turn out to be the same people who want Jesus crucified.

What about the Apostles? When Jesus told them that one of them would pretend that he didn't know him, and one would betray him, they couldn't believe this. They began to argue over who would do such a thing.

How many times have you thought that someone was your friend and then they did something to hurt your feelings? Did you wonder if they were really your friend after all? Remember, it isn't always easy to be a good friend or a faithful person. Sometimes people make mistakes because they are afraid to stand up for what they know is right. Sometimes they just get a little confused and forget what is right. And sometimes they just choose to do the wrong thing.

So what do you do when someone lets you down? How do you make things right again when someone isn't a good friend or faithful person? Think about what Jesus did. He didn't blame those people who one day called him "King" and then another day wanted him crucified. He didn't turn his back on his friends because they betrayed him or said they didn't know him. He forgave them. Can you do the same thing for the people that let you down? Can you forgive them? Before you answer, remember that all through Lent we talk about our sins, the things we do that make us feel far away from God. We ask God for forgiveness and try to find ways to be better people. If God gives us that chance to try again, shouldn't we be giving that same chance to other people too? Remember the Lord's Prayer, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."
