

Homebound Ministry

Hello everyone,

We are called to participate in the liturgical life of the Church, which includes celebrating feasts, solemnities, and memorials. However, we may be confused about which days are considered holy days of obligation, and what that means for our participation in the life of the Church.

There are three types of feasts in the Church liturgy: memorial, feast, and solemnity. Solemnities are the celebrations for the most important mysteries of faith and some great saints. Some solemnities are holy days of obligation, but some are not.

The holy days of obligation in the United States consist of Immaculate Conception, Christmas, Mary Mother of God, Assumption, and All Saints. These days are considered solemnities, and we are required to attend Mass on these days. However, when these feast days fall on Saturday or Monday, they are still solemnity but not obligatory. Sundays are always solemnities to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and are obligatory for us to attend Mass.

Feasts are celebrations that give honor to a mystery or title of the Lord, Our Lady, or saints that are significant, like the apostles and Evangelists, or those that are historically important, such as St. Lawrence the deacon. Meanwhile, memorials usually commemorate saints, although they may also honor a particular aspect of the Lord or of Mary.

Participating in the liturgical life of the Church is a great way to grow in faith and deepen our relationship with God. By understanding which days are considered holy days of obligation, we can ensure that we are actively participating in the life of the Church and fulfilling our obligations as Catholics. Let us celebrate these feasts, solemnities, and memorials with reverence and gratitude for the gifts of our faith.



Music Ministry



I'll be playing my second wedding of the season this weekend and I'm in the thick of the planning with couples, so weddings have been on my mind. Instead of focusing on the readings at Mass today, I'm going to give some thoughts on a peaceful approach to planning your wedding Mass.

I've been a part of many, many weddings in my career. The most beautiful (and peaceful!) ones involve couples that take a certain amount of care in the planning of their wedding liturgy. Part of this planning is understanding what their wedding in the Church is and what it is not. Instead of approaching the wedding Mass or ceremony as something totally customizable, the couple understands the liturgy is something they will participate in that is bigger than just themselves. They understand that wedding liturgy is also worship of God. (This is why we play instrumental hymns or music instead of using personal favorite secular songs.) The couple also reads through the available readings and chooses the scriptures that are meaningful to them. This is also a great way to begin praying together and growing together spiritually.

I encourage couples to be as intentional about their wedding ceremony as the reception, and you don't have to do it alone. I enjoy meeting with the couples and working with them to prepare a beautiful wedding liturgy. If you are getting married at the parish this year, please remember to schedule a wedding planning meeting at least 6-8 weeks in advance of your wedding. I look forward to meeting you.
