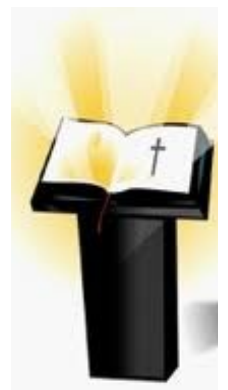

## Homebound Ministry

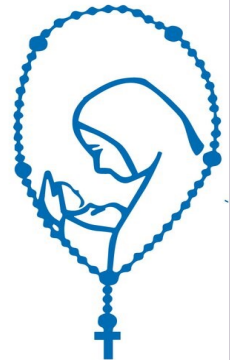
Hello everyone,

This weekend, we enter the month of May which is a month dedicated to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. This tradition started in the 13th century. The Marian month is chosen in May, a renewing time of the year as a way to honor Mary who gives new life, the Savior to the world.

In the 18th century, the members of the Jesuit order developed the honor to Mary during May in their schools in Rome, then this honor for Mary has gradually spread over in the universal Church. In 1947, Pope Pius XII promoted and approved this beautiful devotion in his Encyclical on the Sacred Liturgy Mediator Dei. Pope Paul VI in his Encyclical on the Month of May of 1965 also emphasizes:

“The month of May is the month which the piety of the faithful is especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady, and it is the occasion for a moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (no. 1).

As we begin the month dedicated to Our Lady, may we take this opportunity to draw closer to our Blessed Mother and offer her our love through praying the Rosary and imitating her virtues. We especially ask for her intercession for peace in Ukraine and in our world.

At the end of the first reading, the disciples leave the Sanhedrin "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name." In the second reading, we get the well-known "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing." In both of these cases, I think we're meant to see that worthiness is not always correlated to happiness or comfort. Here, it's linked to death and dishonor.

In these cases, we might think about some of the qualities needed to suffer dishonor or to die for God's sake: courage, commitment to the truth, perseverance in the face of adversity. How can we better strive for these today and every day this week?

## Faith Formation

*Alleluia! Alleluia! Give Praise to the Risen Lord!*

Hello Everyone,

This week we celebrate the Third Sunday of Easter. Our Lenten Season has ended and we have relived our death in Christ. It has been a season of reflection and growth, and it has given us the ability to understand what it is we are called to as disciples and allows us to celebrate our triumph over death with the Risen Lord.

Triumph; what a wonderful word! Our Easter Season is one of incredible triumph. It is as if we are offered the opportunity to entomb all of the pain and despair of the past year and rise above it to renewed life. We have offered up our pain and suffering, died and been reborn! What will this new life hold for us? Through the sacrifice of Christ, we have the opportunity to be TRIUMPHANT!

This feeling of triumph comes over me each year as we receive the Holy Oils from the Chrism Mass and place them in our ambry during our Holy Thursday celebration of The Mass of The Lord's Supper. I think about those who were anointed with our Holy Oils during the past year, and all of the years prior to that. Faces run through my mind. Their stories are remembered. Prayers that had once been offered are reiterated. As I see the Holy Oils, I think about the triumph of those people. Some have been anointed with the Oil of the Sick and triumphed over fear and desperation and been led in one-way or another to peace. Some have been anointed with the Oil of the Catechumen and triumphantly opened their hearts and minds to the Living Word. And those who have been anointed with the Chrism Oil triumphantly embraced their role as priest, prophet and king. These sacred oils changed the lives of those they touched and their triumphs became our triumphs. This is just one of the ways in which we are all connected to one another. We are joyful as we celebrate our lives together and we suffer with each other in times of sorrow. It is this oneness that we celebrate as God's children, that makes us triumphant in his name.
