

Homebound Ministry

Hello everyone,

While ministering at the funeral services, I often receive questions from families about which podium in the church to use to proclaim the Word or for sharing eulogies. In this article, I would like to clarify the difference between these two words and their respective purposes and meanings.

Ambo is a Greek word which means "step" or "elevation." The ambo is typically located on the left side of the sanctuary. According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, the ambo is reserved for proclaiming the Scripture readings, the Responsorial Psalm, the Easter Proclamation, the Homily, and the Universal Prayer. Therefore, only ministers of the Word are permitted to stand at the ambo to perform their task of proclaiming the Word of God to the faithful. During Mass, the ambo reveals Christ amidst His people through His Holy Word. When the Holy Scriptures are read, it is Jesus who speaks to His people. Therefore, we should show reverence to the ambo just as we do to the altar.

On the other hand, the pulpit or cantor's stand is used mainly for pastoral or administrative purposes. It is located near the sanctuary and is designated for many other purposes, such as parish announcements, funeral eulogies, guest talks, and non-liturgical events.

I hope that this brief explanation brings greater awareness of the ambo and enhances our Mass experience as we more fully embrace the richness of the Liturgy of the Word.

On this Mothers' Day, I would like to extend my warmest wishes to all mothers in our parish. May God bless you abundantly with love, joy, and peace on this special day and always.


Remember to dress for the weather, we distribute rain or shine.
