Homebound Ministry

Hello everyone,

One of Saint Mary Magdalen's parishioners approached me and raised a question regarding the prayer of the psalms. I hope many of you are interested in this question. So here is a brief summary of the Book of Psalms and the use of it in the liturgy of the Church.

The Psalms make up the longest book of the Bible and are comprised of songs, prayers, and poetry in devotion to God. King David is attributed with writing 75 of the 150 Psalms. The remaining Psalms are attributed to various other authors including King Solomon and Moses, with about 50 of the Psalms not being attributed to any particular author.

The Book of Psalms is one of the most beloved books of the Bible and for good reason! The Psalms offer comfort in times of despair, strength in trials, and celebration in times of triumph. Jesus Himself quoted the Psalms when he spoke his last words on the Cross, saying, "*Father, into Your hands I commend my spirit*" (*Luke 23:46; Psalm 31:5*). The Church uses the Psalms widely in the liturgy and in prayer. They are read on Sunday and weekday Masses after the first reading. In addition, the Church uses Psalms as the official prayer which is called the Liturgy of the Hours to be recited every day by the clergy and consecrated people.

Praying the Psalms binds us together in the prayer of the universal Church. How beautiful it is as we sing psalms! Sometimes the attitudes and feelings of psalms do not fit our emotions, it is when we pray in union with other members of the Church who are experiencing those feelings.

Saint Paul recommends us: "singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God" (Cl 3: 16). May the Psalms lift us closer to God and in union with one another.

Happy Graduation to all of our high school seniors! I can't believe that we are once again at the end of the school year and celebrating the accomplishments of our graduates. It feels like the year has flown by! I know that this time can be bittersweet for many of our seniors. The end of high school marks a time of transition—whether into the workforce, vocational education, or university/college education. It's also a time that's a bit bittersweet, which I think is the nature of many major life changes.	I wanted to take this opportunity the publically thank the <i>catechists</i> that so generously offered their time, treasure and talent to this year's Faith Formation students. So, THANK YOU! You have been wonderful examples of discipleship by witnessing your faith. It reminds me of Matthew's account of Jesus' parable of the sowing of the seeds. You have sown seed on good ground that will indeed bear fruit and bring forth thirty, sixty, one hundred fold. You have much to be proud of and again we are grateful for your
While it's normal to feel loss and some sadness at what's ending, it's also normal to feel both excited and maybe even nervous about what's ahead. I think that the Easter season serves as an ongoing reminder of what these changes and emotions mean for us. The first reading today does an especially good job at offering a glimpse of what's in store. Although Jesus is no longer with the disciples at the time of the first reading, they have not given up the mission of discipleship. Just the opposite! They are traveling all around their world to share the good news, committing to their mission of making disciples of others. We get a list of locations in the first reading: Lystra, Iconium, Antioch, Pisidia, Pamphylia, Perga, Attalia. Even shough these locations might not ring a bell or seem like much today, a look at ancient maps shows a journey that would have been hundreds of miles, which is a long fourney if you're going by foot or by boat. It's also far from	gifts. I also wanted to mention that even though I joke about being excited for our summer break, I will in many ways be sorry to see the formation year come to an end. I will miss being greeted with hugs and smiles on Wednesday evenings. I will miss hearing the stories of what happened the week before. I will miss watching the students develop relationships within the parish community. And I will miss the energy of us all coming together in one place to share and grow in our faith I think we all missed that during the past couple of years. During this past formation year we also said goodbye to two of our catechists, Bob Dodde and Kenton Kurth. These two men were beloved and made an impact in our lives. Their presence is greatly missed, and our prayers continue to go out
home for many of the disciples, but they are strengthened by their purpose and mission. Our graduates are getting ready to go out into the wider world, to share their gifts and their faith with others. A part of high school, I think, is learning more about who God is calling you to be.
