

A Time to Review & A Time to Rebuild

We all know the popular Bible Passage from the Book of Ecclesiastics, Chapter 3 verse 1 to 8. This passage has been read at graduations, baptisms, funerals, & other occasions. Recently our parish had an opportunity to look back & honor one of our charter members & generous benefactor, Dolly Konwinski. She loved the game of baseball & wanted the future generations of St Mary Magdalen Parish to come together & enjoy it. She set out with that vision & inspired others around her to help create the ball fields in the back of our church, so many generations could experience this great American game. I have been able to talk to many parishioners & non-parishioners who have played ball on our "field of dreams" for many generations. In fact, the entire Kentwood community has been blessed with these fields & come together to play baseball from spring to early summer for over 50 years. Now, the Kentwood Baseball League (KBL) has decided to expand its program & include softball. Hence, its new name is Kentwood Baseball & Softball League (KBSL).

In honor of Dolly Konwinski for her vision & tireless effort, the parish & I have had a small ceremony & a plaque dedicated to her. It is located in the back of the church, close to the Diakonai sign and is available for you to check out. We have also used this occasion to repair & fix up all of our existing signs. Some of them were in bad shape or not helpful in showing you were to go. We have been blessed to have Valley City Sign (located at 5009 Grand River Rd, Comstock Park, MI 49321) help us with this project. This company has donated over half of its cost & done a great job for us. I ask you to keep them in your thoughts & prayers. However, we still have half of it's cost to be paid yet, roughly about \$9,000. If you can make a donation to this project, we would be very grateful for it.

Our tent was started around the time that our church was built with the intention of being a rental for all sorts of occasions. Unfortunately, it has been a money sucking black hole for our parish. We have had to spend three to five thousand dollars to clean & repair it every year for almost 15 years. Furthermore, the tent company that helps us with that only puts it up & requires us to take it down. Our volunteers are getting older & cannot climb the ladders to take down the tent every year. That job is a big liability to our volunteers. Besides, we have not had many people who want to rent except using it for our Parish Festival. That's why before Covid-19 we conducted a parish wide survey about the tent & 90% of our parish would like it converted to a permanent structure to save us its annual cleaning & repairing costs & allow us to use it year round.

I wanted to begin this building project 3 years ago, but the Diocese required us to participate in its big fundraising for "Our Shepherd Our Future" campaign to support seminarian training. Then, Covid-19 came along & turned our church worshipping experience upside down. Although our church attendance is not back to the level before Covid-19, I cannot wait any longer for the right time to convert our tent to a permanent structure. I ask you to make sacrifices & contribute to this building project "A Time to Review & A Time to Rebuild", Ecclesiastics 3:1-8, as I work with the Diocese & our parish on this endeavor. With your commitment & God's help, we will complete this project for the future of St Mary Magdalen Parish. With much appreciation & prayers,

Homebound Ministry

Happy Feast of Ascension!

In the Gospel, Jesus frequently uses the word "Amen." We also conclude our prayers with "Amen" and respond with "Amen" when receiving Holy Communion. So, what does "Amen" mean? "Amen" is a Hebrew word that signifies agreement, emphasis, and truth.

When Jesus says "Amen, amen, I say to you..." in the Gospel, he is emphasizing the importance of the words he is about to teach. It can be translated as "truly, truly" or "verily, verily."

At the end of a prayer, "Amen" can be translated as "So be it" (CCC 2856). When we say "Amen" after the celebrant's prayer, it not only signifies our desire for those prayers to be accepted but also indicates that the prayer is our own, which we offer wholeheartedly. Particularly in the Mass, there is the Great Amen, often sung solemnly together at the end of the Eucharistic Prayer when the priest elevates the host and the chalice, he says, "Through Him, and with Him, and in Him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever." We respond with the Great Amen, signifying "Yes! Truly, I believe!"

Lastly, "Amen" means "I believe." When the priest or minister proclaims, "The Body of Christ," and we respond "Amen," it signifies, "Yes! I am convinced that Christ has come to dwell in me in the form of this bread and wine." Therefore, there is no better response than this simple and beautiful "Amen."

I hope that understanding the meaning of "Amen" can help us respond with greater awareness during Holy Mass and in our daily prayers.


Next weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. Don't forget to wear red if you want to match the liturgical color!
