Pope Benedict affirmed that this sacred gesture serves as a constant reminder of the indwelling presence of the Trinity within us.



Music Ministry


My children's school has been doing monthly pep rallies to build community. The kids are divided into groups, given a team color and compete in various challenges for bragging rights. Everyone is encouraged to wear their team colors, but last week some middle schoolers outdid themselves and additionally donned wigs and even carried staffs (the why and how of this last part still puzzles me!) My son's friend had donned a long, grey wig and was carrying a staff and said, "Look mom, Zach is Moses!" I love bantering with these boys so I said, "Oh really? OK, Moses, what were the 10 Commandments God gave you, in order?" After only a beat, he responded, "Oh, those? He didn't give those to me yet!" I laughed at the cleverness and quickness of his evasive answer. Their "Green Team" eventually won first place in the competition. Perhaps it had something to do with how close Moses was with God!

Reviewing the readings for today brought that fun memory up, but in all seriousness, I think it is worth noting that immediately after being given the commandments, God descends with Moses to the people and identifies himself: "The LORD, the LORD, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Most people don't immediately link "you shall nots" with kindness and mercy, but really, it was a kindness of God to show the Israelites the path of life when they had forgotten Him after generations of living in Egypt and adopting pagan customs and gods. God has willed the salvation of his people, of the whole world after it falls to sin and he was not content to lose us forever. Just as a parent gives rules and boundaries in order to bring up their children to healthy adulthood, God has personally showed us the path that will lead to eternal life and not only that, the Father sent the son who sacrificed himself for us in the person of Christ to open the gates of heaven. Even more, Christ sent the Holy Spirit to be with us after he ascended. The Eucharist stays as our food and strength and we have the Church as teacher and source of the sacraments.



We truly are given an arsenal to live the life of union with God, which as Christians, is our ultimate goal.
