
# Woodstock memories make you smile? Music makes you happy! We have you covered!

Hello everyone,

Our religious community has a beautiful tradition of picking up the gifts of the Holy Spirit on the feast day of Pentecost. I am very excited to get involved in this event and the gift that I always love to acquire is Courage. The reason I like this gift is because it gives me strength to overcome my fear and willingly take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ.

The book of the prophet Isaiah (11: 1-2) presents us seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, fear of the Lord. We all received these gifts at our Baptism and they are confirmed in us through the sacrament of Confirmation. The gifts of the Holy Spirit are important and necessary for our Christian life. There may be a time when we may desire a particular gift more than others: the gift of courage in times of difficulty, the gift of wisdom to make decisions, the gift of piety to draw close to our Lord.

The gift of Courage gives Jesus' disciples the power to go out to all nations despite persecution, accusation, and death. The Holy Spirit guided them to witness for Christ to the last breath. I recently learned that the Eastern rites of the Catholic Church traditionally speak of what God is *not*, rather than Who God *is*, as it is easier to communicate that concept than to use human words to describe the indescribable. This makes sense to me, especially when discussing the Holy Spirit, who always seemed difficult to grasp. The image of "a dove" or "tongues of fire" or the phrase "rushing wind" only added to the mystery. Despite knowing this Third Person of the Trinity was God and was living in me since baptism, I felt far away from this life giver who was meant to animate my soul.

A few years ago I saw a depiction in, of all places, a Hollywood film called *The Shack*. (The movie is not an accurate depiction of Catholic theology, but provided great food for thought for me.) A woman was tending an overgrown garden with great patience and love. The man she invited into the garden was overwhelmed by the "mess," but she described it as "beautiful." As she took a scythe to the wild leaves and blooms, she handed the man a spade with the instruction, "make sure you gets the roots so it doesn't grow back." The garden was not surprisingly the man's soul. The description of the garden as "beautiful" despite its mess touched me, and the working together of the man and the Spirit was an image that has stayed with me. It helped me see the Holy Spirit not as some Other, but in relationship with me. I began to pray, to build an openness, to the Sprit. Despite my many failures to always live as I should, I no longer feel a distance with the Spirit. In fact, at the times God feels far away, it is the Holy Spirit in my soul that I find most easy to turn to, because the Spirit of God is actively tending to me, and is there to sanctify me and lead me to my destiny: living out my vocation, loving my neighbor, and leading me to union with God. Below is one of the prayers I have found helpful on this journey:

Dear Holy Spirit,

You are my friend.

I give you myself.

I ask you to dwell deeply inside of me and make me holy.

I want to know the fire of God's love.

I want to love God with all my heart.
