

# **Music Ministry**

Happy Feast of Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ)! One of my favorite couplets from St. Thomas Aquinas' famous Eucharistic hymn, Adoro Te Devote, translated to English by Anthony Petti, is: "Wounds that doubting Thomas saw/ I could never see,/ But I still acknowledge you/ my true God to be."

This is truthful. Most of us will never see a vision of Christ or experience stigmata, but we do experience the miraculous at each Mass we attend. Unfortunately, because it is routine, our reception of the Eucharist may become routine, or worse, because we do not see the changes in the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ with our eyes, we may even begin to doubt his presence is a true and physical sense. We see even when Christ was the priest, some turned away at the First Eucharist. "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him." (John 6:66) In his mercy, throughout the ages, God has allowed certain miracles to occur in the Eucharistic to correct and encourage his people. I recommend the book Miracles of the Eucharist by Bob and Penny Lord. It has been years since I read this book, but I remember certain stories even now.

I also recommend reading about one of the church's most recent blesseds, Carlos Acutis. Bl. Carlos was a devout, happy, and tech-savvy teenager who lived totally for God. Even though his family weren't practicing Catholics, he responded to what could only be grace and became a daily Communicant as a child. His life revolved around the Eucharist and he wanted to promote and share this with the world. As a computer programmer, he built a website cataloguing and promoting all the known Eucharistic miracles of the world. You can access this website made by a future Saint here: <a href="http://www.miracolieucaristici.org/">http://www.miracolieucaristici.org/</a> Even though he was only 15 when he succumbed to leukemia, he said, "I'm happy to die because I've lived my life without wasting even a minute of it doing things that wouldn't have pleased God." He died in 2006. If you find the idea of the True Presence too much to take literally, or "out there," I recommend asking for Bl. Carlos' intercession. I'm sure he will continue to help the Faithful foster their belief in the Eucharist from heaven.


