Homebound Ministry

Hello Everyone,

Happy Father's Day to all fathers! May God shower you with abundant blessings on this special day and grant you good health, peace, and joy always.

We have completed the first year of the Eucharistic Revival at the diocesan level and are now transitioning to the second phase: the parish revival, which takes place from June 11, 2023, to July 17, 2024. During the Eucharistic Revival Day of the diocese on June 10 at Aquinas Campus, I was captivated by numerous stories of Eucharistic miracles that have occurred throughout the world. It is my intention to share these miracles with you each week, as we pray for the strengthening of our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus.

One of the remarkable miracles took place at St. Hyacinth's Church in Legnica, Poland, in 2013. During the Christmas Mass, a sacred host accidentally fell to the ground. It was then placed in a container with water and kept in the tabernacle for dissolution. After almost two weeks, the pastor, along with another priest, examined it and discovered a red spot on the surface of the host. This finding led to a scientific analysis, which astonishingly revealed similarities to "human heart muscle with alterations that often appear during agony."

May God bless you all abundantly as we continue our journey of faith together.



The Word in Our Lives

Part of being a believer is knowing that God keeps his promises. And how do we know that? Because he has kept them in the past. If we lose hope or begin to doubt whether he will help us, we remember what he has already done. That's what Paul is talking about in the second reading. Christ died for us when we were sinners, so Paul concludes that now that we have been saved from sin, we will also be saved from death. So now we are free from sin and death. Isn't that enough?

Jesus shows that there is still more that God can do. When he saw the crowds in today's gospel, he pitied them because they were "like sheep without a shepherd." They seemed to need leaders, someone who could show them the way to God. So Jesus responds in two ways.

First, he teaches his disciples to pray for more leaders. What he means is that if people are to lead the Church, they must be sent by God. They are not elected by popular vote. They are "elected" or called by God to serve. Jesus is teaching us to pray for Church leaders today. We can pray for all who have leadership roles, that they are filled with wisdom and strength. Jesus also teaches us to pray for vocations to religious life.

The second thing Jesus does is to send the twelve apostles out to proclaim the kingdom and cure diseases. He shows us that along with prayer, we need to take action. This may mean offering our help to parish leaders, serving a term on the parish council, or encouraging our children to consider a religious vocation.

Why should we do these things? Remember what Paul said about God saving us from sin and death. God gives these gifts without cost. He simply asks us to pass on that good news of salvation. That is what leadership in the Church is all about.
