### **Music Ministry**

Summer and Fall see the bulk of our weddings at St Mary Magdalen. There have been three weddings at St Mary Magdalen in the past three weekends, with at least one a month through the fall. Next year's calendar is already filling up as well. Because my mind is on weddings, I thought this would be a good time to share the process for those interested.



share the process for those interested in or already signed up for weddings in the parish.

Initially, couples will call the office, speak to Laura or Michelle, and set up a time to meet with Father Peter. Couples will be given a book with music suggestions, scripture options, a wedding planning sheet, instructions on requirements for the wedding (pre-marriage prep is a must), and instructions on what to do next.

Couples should contact me at least 2 months before the wedding, though we can meet earlier. It is the responsibility of the couple to call or email me to set an appointment for music planning. It is at this meeting we can discuss specific requests such as extra musicians or a specific cantor, etc.

Some couples wish to use an alternate musician. This is possible if we have a conversation. I will need to speak to the musicians (do they understand a Catholic liturgy?) as well as review the final wedding music plan (music still needs to be sacred and appropriate for mass). There would be a reduced fee for the wedding planning and audio work I would be required to do at the wedding as well.

Lastly, all items needed for the wedding (proof of prep classes, marriage license, baptismal notifications, wedding planning sheet, and all fees) are due two weeks before the wedding. We have had last minute paperwork come in the day before, and that is very stressful!

The goal is to prepare and help you experience not just a beautiful wedding day, but a lifetime of the sacrament of marriage. If you have any questions throughout the process, reach out to us at the parish office or stop in the office. We are more than happy to help. Please remember and follow these guidelines so we can have enough time to prepare and execute our part during the busy wedding and other liturgical seasons.

### **Youth Ministries**

Hello everyone!

Since this is my last bulletin column as the youth minister, I wanted to take some extra space to look back on the last almost-five years and to look ahead to the future.

Youth Ministry was never on my radar as a potential job. If someone had told me as a high school student that I would eventually work for the parish, I wouldn't have believed them. Even when I returned to Grand Rapids from my time living in Los Angeles, the only things I knew were that I wanted to work in the non-profit sector and that I wanted to focus on youth. I wouldn't have thought to look toward the Church, but after reading Chad's resignation in the bulletin the week after I settled into town, something told me that this was where I was called to be. Moving from Los Angeles had already involved a long process of discernment, and when I was hired it felt as though things had fallen into place.

Now, as I'm leaving youth ministry to grow my own business, I think I'm coming to a better understanding of why God called me to serve when and how He did. Going forward, I'm never going to fully stop being a youth minister—even if I no longer have the job title. Ministry is forever a part of my DNA, and it will continue to form how I run my business and how I interact with the people in my life. Working for the Church has taught me what it means to form communities of practice, to be of service, and to better orient myself and my actions toward the Lord. It's helped me to grow in patience and understanding. In short, being in Youth Ministry has been more than a job; it's been a gift.

In the future, I will be volunteering more actively around the parish as a parishioner of St. Mary Magdalen, but for now I am excited to explore the new path that God has put before me and take a small break from parish life. You'll still see me at Mass, of course, and I'm looking forward to serving with our students on our Mission Trip to Cincinnati, but I'm also looking forward to taking a few steps back.

That said, youth programming at the parish will continue! Molly and I have been working diligently these last few weeks to make sure that we're on the same page regarding NCYC 2023, High School Faith Formation for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year, and other events for youth and young adults. I encourage everyone to continue to support these programs, because the youth aren't the future of our church. They're the *now* of our church, and they deserve to be seen as the young protagonists that they are.

Thank you all so much for reading these bulletin articles (including this long novel of one!) and supporting me in ministry over the years.
