Homebound Ministry

Hello everyone,

The terrible Holocaust occurring between the years of 1941-1945 and took the lives of over six million European Jews. It creates hatred and suffering leading to the damage of hope and happiness of many people. However, in the midst of great suffering, it arises some heroic saints such as Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross and Saint Maximilian Kolbe. They prove to us the true faith in God and show us how to deal with suffering in life without losing our faith in God.

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) is from a Jewish family in Germany. At the age of 14, she considers herself as an atheist. With her intelligence, she becomes a talented philosopher. Afterwards, inspired by the story of the life of Saint Teresa Avila, Edith receives the grace of baptism to become children of God.

Edith joins the Carmelite convent and changes the name to sister Benedicta of the Cross. She learns and writes a lot about the mystery of the cross. Eventually, she is drawn to meditate more on the love and suffering of Jesus. She confirms that: "One can only gain the knowledge of the cross if one has thoroughly experienced the cross".

Sister Benedicta was arrested, along with many Jewish people, and was gassed to death. She expressed her willingness to suffer like Jesus and to fulfill God's will in her life. There is no word to explain why God lets all the suffering and pain going on. I am touched by the comment of Prof. Jan Nota on this heroic woman: "She is a witness to God's presence in a world where God is absent".

Saint Benedicta of the Cross was beatified and canonized by Pope John Paul II. Her feast day is August 9th. As we celebrate her feast day, we ask for the grace to trust in God when struggling with many difficulties in life and recognize God's presence with us in the midst of suffering.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and Children

The process of initiation begins with the question, "Am I called to this Faith?". Inquiry is not a commitment to continue on to full initiation, it is simply where we begin to answer questions about the Faith and the Church.

As the process continues men, women and even children are guided and cared for as they awaken in faith and are gradually introduced to the life of the Roman Catholic Church.

The goal of the process is to provide an intellectual and spiritual framework for conversion. Our faith community welcomes the participants, supports them on their journey and cares for them through prayer and fellowship as they journey towards full initiation.

Classes for elementary age children and adults begin on Wednesday, September 14th at 6:15 pm. The classes are held in rooms 14 & 15 respectively. High School participants will meet on Sunday mornings.

Bringing Back The Ministry
