

Faith Formation News!

Classes Begin: Wednesday, September 13, 2023 at 6:15 p.m.

<u>Fall Adult Faith Formation Class Topics</u>: The continuation of the book, "No Wonder They Call Him The Savior". Watch the bulletin for a new series that will begin in January.

Children's Liturgy of the Word: Offered during the 9 & 11 a.m. Masses for children ages 3-8 beginning on 9/10. No registration necessary. Fr. Peter will dismiss children prior to the Liturgy of the Word, children will be led to classrooms in the Family Center and return to parents prior to Communion.

Sacramental Preparation: 2nd grade students will be preparing for the celebration of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. A schedule and further information will be given to the parents of all students registered in that grade. 8th grade students will be preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation. A schedule of service projects and retreats will be given to the parents of all students registered in that grade. RCIA/RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation) classes will take place during our scheduled Wednesday Faith Formation classes. A schedule of Marriage and Baptism preparation classes can be obtained by calling the Parish Office.

Wednesday Evening Faith Formation Schedule:

- 5:15-6:00 p.m- Dinner is served in the Family Center. (\$2 for children, \$3 for adults with a maximum of \$10 per family).
- 6:15pm-7:45pm- Parents of elementary age students drop off and pick up their child/children at their classroom, middle school and high school students are released from class. Note that HS classes take place in the BAC.

<u>Code of Conduct</u>: All students will be asked to review and sign and adhere to a Code of Conduct document at the beginning of the year outlining the expectations we hold for them during our time together.

Christian Services

Last week, we had our monthly Feeding America West Michigan food truck and it was a beautiful day. We gave food to 219 families consisting of 866 people, 372 children, 153 seniors, and 17 veterans.

There are 399 mobile food pantries in Kent County and we are #5 for pounds of food distributed. The drivers frequently say we are a well-oiled machine. Thank you to all the volunteers who come out every month to help. You are awesome.

Music Ministry

Last week I introduced a new communion hymn called "Make of Our Hands a Throne" by Steven Warner of Notre Dame (Indiana). I learned this song in college and the lyrics and melody have stuck with me all these years. This being the Year of the Eucharist, I thought it was a good time to bring this song to you.

The refrain (and title) references an early Church Father, St. Cyril of Jerusalem, who in the 5th century instructed those receiving the Eucharist to, "...make your left hand a throne for your right hand, since the latter is to receive the king." Despite its name, this song is not to play into the debate about how to receive the Eucharist- since both the ancient practice of in the hands or the later practice of the tongue are both licit- but to meditate upon the mystery and gift God has given us in himself in the Eucharist. The text gives ample food for thought. I am reprinting the text below for you to sing along with or browse later. I hope this song speaks to you as well.

FACILITIES UPDATE

Family Center Kitchen Floor

Thank you to all who have so generously contributed \$3,435 to help cover the cost of installing new ceramic tile in the Family Center kitchen. Please prayerfully consider giving to support this next phase of the kitchen and family center renovation. The cost of the tiles was \$3,500 which does not include the labor costs for installation.

Thank you to several parishioners who helped with the removal of the old tiles (members of the Men's Group and the Knights of Columbus). Since all of the old floor tiles were removed and the majority of the kitchen furniture and supplies were taken out, it gave us an opportunity to paint the walls a fresh coat of blue. The hope is to have the kitchen floor finished and the kitchen fully operational by September 1st.

Breitenstein Activity Center HVAC Units

Unfortunately, as our buildings continue to show their age with wear and tear, one of the two furnace/AC units has failed. After 21 years of service, Unit #1 is no longer operable. The replacement cost is around \$9,600.

Church/Family Center HVAC System

We continue to have challenges with the heating, cooling and ventilation system in the church/family center building. Even though the church was rebuilt and dedicated in 2014, we are already seeing signs of aging and obsolescence. Issues with the HVAC control systems have continued to plague us over the past couple of years. For this reason, we are doing a Control Commissioning of the HVAC systems. This will cost around \$4,000 and will include the following:

- Site survey
- Onsite equipment and sensor functional testing
- Graphic review and verification
- Retro-Commissioning Report
- Distributed issue log for review
- Sequencing and programming verification

Once completed, we will have a baseline of our system and have a starting point to troubleshoot and hopefully identify the root cause(s) of our HVAC system.

Maintenance Fund envelopes support the costs to repair and maintain all of our campus facilities. As good stewards, we are called to be caretakers of these facilities that allow us to accomplish our mission of sharing the Gospel message with all in our local faith community. Thank you for your continued stewardship of treasure in support of St. Mary Magdalen Parish!


