

Welcome Back to a New School Year!

I hope you had a relaxed & enjoyable summer with your family & friends. The Parish staff & I have tried to enjoy our summer as much as possible. For we have been so busy with funerals, weddings, baptisms, church maintenance, & church issues since this past Easter. It means our parish is alive & growing. Yet, we still need a lot of your participation in ministries at Mass such as Eucharistic ministers, Lectors, Choir members, & ushers as well as financial contributors.

These needs are mostly at the 5pm Sunday Mass, one of the very few offered in the Diocese of Grand Rapids. Other parishes & their volunteers are done after the 11am Mass but here at St Mary Magdalen, the parish and I have committed ourselves to keep the 5pm Sunday Mass available year round. We ask you to sign up to be our parishioners & to help us out with the ministries for that Mass, so we continue to have the resources to provide it.

As the Diocese lets me stay at St Mary Magdalen Parish for another term of 6 years, I ask for your participation & financial contributions to help me provide good spiritual services for the parish.

First, we have worked hard all summer long on our frequently used kitchen. A new tile floor and paint job have completed the drain and new dishwasher projects. Your financial contributions for this work is greatly appreciated. Hopefully, we can do the same for the rest of the Family Center and replace it's old floor & carpeting that has been here since it was first built in the 50's.

Secondly, as we have grown a bit older, anniversaries mean a lot more to us, especially in this uncertain time. The staff & I have talked about helping the parish celebrate your wedding anniversaries with a formal acknowledgement of Papal Blessing from the Holy Father. We will post a couple of certificates in the back of church for you to check out. All you have to do is call the Parish Office & let us know when & at which Mass you would like to renew your wedding vows.

Thirdly, our Faith Formation programs, including Sundays "Children's Liturgy of the Word", will begin soon. We need lots of volunteers to help run the Wednesday night classes & the Sunday CLOW sessions. Please help us with those needs.

Finally, after four years at St Mary Magdalen Parish, our music director has chosen to seek employment at another church with better compensation to support her family. In spite of our moderate annual pay increase, our parish budget cannot match the pay of the other church for her position. I want to thank Emily for her ministry here & wish her the best at her new employment. As I put together the search committee for her replacement, I want to suspend all the choirs temporarily, & ask you to provide me the financial resources needed to find the next best Music Director & keep me in your prayers. I trust that God will lead the right candidates to us & help us build a better music program than before.

May God bless you & your loved ones and continue to guide our parish in the new school year.

Hello everyone,

Three weeks ago, I attended a conference led by Father Paul Shelton, S.J., one of the 50 priests chosen nationwide to be an official Eucharistic Preacher during the National Eucharistic Revival. He emphasized the importance of living a Eucharistic life through four words spoken during the Mass consecration: taken, blessed, broken, and given. The word "taken" deeply resonated with me and has profoundly influenced how I approach Mass.

Indeed, Jesus took bread and blessed it to become His body, an act of His own free will. Similarly, we are chosen by God for a unique role in His story. Jesus desires to take our lives and sanctify them. He invites each of us to offer our lives to Him so that He can bless us and be present within us. Every time we attend Mass, He encourages us to present something to Him: our lives, our gifts, our daily sacrifices, our weaknesses, our sickness, our concerns, our struggles, the intentions of others, and the needs of the world.

The question I ask myself before Holy Mass is, "What do I offer to God today?" We may not expect to gain anything from Mass if we offer nothing at all. Let us present our lives to Jesus, beseeching Him to take and bless them so that they may become blessings for ourselves and for the world.

Music Ministry

The tongue is a powerful thing. Proverbs 18:21 says "Death and life are in the power of the tongue." For the past year or so I've come to consider more the words I speak. My conscience has been perking up more and more when I come close to that line between venting and seeking support into gratuitous sharing. Reading this week's gospel prompted me to see what the Church officially taught about our speech. It was eye opening and convicting.

The CCC says, "Respect for the reputation of persons forbids every attitude and word likely to cause them unjust injury. He becomes guilty:

- of rash judgment who, even tacitly, assumes as true,
 without sufficient foundation, the moral fault of a neighbor;
 of detraction who, without objectively valid reason,
 discloses another's faults and failings to persons who did not know them;
- of calumny who, by remarks contrary to the truth, harms the reputation of others and gives occasion for false judgments concerning them (2477).

(To be clear, we are not talking about hiding or covering up abuse, speaking to authorities in an investigation or the like. These are pursuit of justice, which is good.)

As a culture, we don't think twice about sharing our personal grievances or giving our opinion on other's situations. In fact, numerous "content creators" make a living doing just this. Even Catholic websites, blogs, and social media platforms build their following based on tearing down one figure or another in the church. We eat it up and fight each other in the comments. Even 400 years ago St. Francis de Sales warned, "The detractor, by one blow of his tongue, commonly commits three murders; he kills his own soul, and the soul of him who listens, and by a spiritual homicide takes away the civil life of the person whom he slanders;

This was more serious that I had realized. But the CCC gives us a way forward, quoting St. Ignatius of Loyola. "To avoid rash judgment, everyone should be careful to interpret insofar as possible his neighbor's thoughts, words, and deeds, in a favorable way" (CCC 2478). "But if he cannot do so, let him ask how the other understands it. And if the latter understands it badly, *let the former correct him with love. If that does not suffice, let the Christian try all suitable ways to bring the other to a correct interpretation so that he may be saved"* (Spiritual Exercises 22). To learn more I recommend reading the above section of the CCC and the article "The Terrible Sin of Telling the Truth" by Matthew Leonard.
