Dear Friends in Christ,

As Catholics, we are called to stand for and create a consistent ethic of life in our communities. This work has never been more important than now. Life is being threatened in our country from the moment of conception to natural death and at many points in between.

Next month Michigan voters have an important decision to make – one that could save the lives of countless unborn children. Proposal 3 would create a new right of abortion in the Michigan Constitution. It would allow abortion throughout pregnancy with no regulations, and with no limitations on who can obtain an abortion. Any person would be able to perform an abortion without any consequences. <u>You are</u> <u>urged to vote NO on Proposal 3.</u>

The Church not only opposes legislation that denies the inherent dignity of each person; she also works toward positive solutions. This is why parishes have taken up the "Walking with Moms in Need" initiative, which helps pregnant women choose life by providing education, essential supplies, and emotional and financial support to raise their children. Catholic Charities West Michigan gave away more than 10,000 diapers and provided counseling to 40 pregnant women free of charge in the last fiscal year so these moms could keep their babies. In addition to Catholic Charities, many Catholics support and volunteer at pregnancy resource centers throughout West Michigan.

Life from the moment of conception is inviolable, so we must uphold the dignity and value of every life to its natural end. This past month, we have joined Pope Francis in praying for the abolition of the death penalty. As the Holy Father reminds us, "...The death penalty is morally inadmissible, for it destroys the most important gift we have received: life." (For the abolition of the death penalty, The Pope Video, September 2022)

During this Respect Life Month, let us reflect more deeply on why every human life is sacred. I invite you to visit the diocesan website (grdiocese.org) for more information on Proposal 3 and Respect Life Month resources to support your efforts. Saint Maximilian Kolbe, pray for us!

Family Center Update—Kitchen Drain Project

Thank you, Thank you, Thank you!!! Due to your generous financial support, we have exceeded our goal of \$15,700 for the estimated repair of the kitchen pipes and drain system. Last weekend, an additional \$350 was received bringing our total to \$15,789 out of the \$15,700 estimated for the repair.

This past summer, the kitchen drain in the Family Center began to backflow and rendered the sinks and dishwasher useless. All-Flo Plumbing inspected the line with a camera and found critical damage/failure within the cast iron pipes and drainage system in the Family Center. Repairs will begin (October 6th) and hopefully will be completed by early to mid October. Any monies received above the goal will be put towards future maintenance/repair funds for our existing buildings and grounds.

Again, thank you for your prayerful consideration and support of the funding of this essential repair of our Family Center Kitchen!

Pregnancy Clinic Assistance

The Knights of Columbus at St. Mary Magdalen is partnering with REACH Pregnancy Aid to help needy families in the community. For the next few weeks, we will be collecting baby supplies outside the parish office (see the little red wagon). The type of baby supplies in urgent need includes diapers, baby wipes, and formula .





FACILITY UPDATE

Summer 2022 Facilities Update

It's been a busy summer on campus here at St. Mary Magdalen Parish. With the help of many dedicated and selfless volunteers as well as some staff parish work days, the campus has received a lot of TLC.

• Family Center renovations

- Painted the upper walls, kitchen wall and wall over the stage with a fresh coat of white paint.
- Installed and replaced three original fans equipped with remote controls and new LED lighting.
- Installed and replaced the bulbs in the globe fixtures.
- *Installed and replaced fluorescent lighting in the overhead fixtures with new LED tubes.*
- Stripped and buffed years of old wax and put down new wax on the floor.
- Church windows in the upper section of the worship space
 - Looking up you will notice water stains from the winter when ice melt seeped into the church ceiling leaving an ugly brown stain. The window seals had failed and new sealant was installed around all of the upper windows to remedy the situation.
 - Still working to repaint the ceiling—the challenge being the height required to access the ceiling.
- Outdoor Stations of the Cross—the Men's Group is working to clear space on the west side of the property to install the Stations of the Cross. Two large trees have been removed and mulched and at least three more trees need to be cleared to prepare the ground for the Stations.
- Parking Lot—needs resurfacing and sealing to survive the harsh Michigan winters. In the meantime, elastomeric sealant has been applied to all the cracks as a stopgap measure.
- Mulching—over 50 cubic yards of mulch have been spread around the flower beds and island beds to help with weed control and beautification of our property.

As our "new" church building continues to age, it is beginning to show wear and tear with additional repairs and maintenance. For example, the heating and cooling, bathroom faucets and some of the lighting have needed repair. The Finance Council is working on a Cost Analysis spreadsheet to plan and prepare for all major facilities needs for years to come. So that when, not if, a system fails, we will, hopefully, have savings set aside to cover the repair or replacement of that equipment/system. It is our goal to be good stewards of our material resources in maintaining our beautiful campus and worship space. We are truly blessed by your Stewardship of financial resources that we are able to accomplish and expand our mission to share the Gospel with all in our local faith community and beyond. Thank you!
