

#### Family Center Update - Kitchen Drain Project

Thank you, Thank you, Thank you!!! Because of your generous financial support, we have exceeded our goal of \$15,700 for the estimated repair of the kitchen pipes and drain system. To date \$15,789 has been collected towards the estimated \$15,700 quoted for the repair.

This past summer, the kitchen drain in the Family Center began to backflow and rendered the sinks and dishwasher useless. All-Flo Plumbing inspected the line with a camera and found critical damage/failure within the cast iron pipes and drainage system in the Family Center. Repairs have begun and, God willing, will be completed by mid October. Any monies received above the goal will fund future maintenance/repairs for our existing buildings and grounds.

#### **Music Ministry**



A few people have asked why I have been using music that is outside of the hymnal at Sunday Mass. I could hear their frustration and know that it is difficult to sing along with songs you do not know, especially songs not printed in the hymnal. I understand this frustration. I remember being irritated as a young person when the choir sang a choral hymn in place of a congregational song. I also remember getting distracted when the psalm melody sung did not fit with the psalm printed in the misallette.

As far as participatory singing goes, the part that belongs to the people and is not to be taken is the Ordinary, or *Kyrie, Gloria; Holy, Holy, Holy; Memorial Acclamation, Amen,* and *Lamb of God.* These are fixed responses in the Mass. The church also allows hymns to be sung during Mass (a development from the chanted *propers* sung by a choir). This allows more participation in the Mass, a good thing, but it also poses difficulty in its seemingly endless possibilities; which song, at what part, what style, how often, what about new music, what about old favorites, and even what language? The most important thing to me when choosing music is the text and how each piece will fit in the liturgy. These interactions have reminded me that I can't forget the people in the pews who want to learn this music and sing along.

After discussing this with staff, it was recommended to send out a constant contact with a link where people can hear the music ahead of time. When possible, I will also use my bulletin space to print out the melody or words for those that have a physical copy. As to the question of why I don't "just use the music in the hymnal," I will continue to use the hymnal with songs that have stood the test of time and are parish favorites, but there is so much good music being composed right now, so many texts that reflect the gospel teaching and melodies that engage a growing congregation. If you have concerns or questions and want to chat, reaching out to me via email is always best. Meeting before or after mass is difficult as I am usually prepping for mass or running to rehearsal and I won't be able to give you the attention that I would like to and you would want.

#### **Homebound Ministry**

Hello everyone,

Recently, I received some questions regarding the Last Rites. It would be quite appropriate to share with you a few words about this in this weekend's article. The Last Rites include three sacraments: Confession, Anointing of the Sick, and Eucharist as Viaticum - Bread for the Journey. Through these sacraments, the receiver will obtain the grace of spiritual healing, comfort, peace, courage and especially the forgiveness of the Lord.

The Last Rites are reserved for Catholics who are in dying situations or about to undergo a serious surgery. We are responsible for our salvation and our spiritual needs. We should not wait until the last moment of death to request these spiritual needs. We also should not depend on hospital or hospice chaplains to take care of this for us. It is wise that we thoroughly plan our own spiritual care, or the care needed for our loved ones ahead of time. Family members can ask for this service on behalf of the sick who are unable to do so.

The priest administers these last sacramental services outside the church such as at home, in the hospital or care facility according to the request. It is ideal that the Last Rites are performed in the presence of family members so that the whole family can join him to pray for their loved one.

Please contact the parish office or Sister Mai Do for advice if you or your loved ones are in need of this spiritual care. We can assist and accompany you on your journey to receive God's healing grace. Finally, let us join our Holy Father with his prayer
