


We will be delivering the holiday baskets on Saturday, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 10:00am. This is a great activity to do as a family.

Hello everyone,

In the principal document of Vatican II, Lumen Gentium, the Church highlights the significance of the Eucharist as "the source and summit of Christian life" (#11). Indeed, through the Eucharist, we are nourished and granted grace, strength, and healing to live our vocation. The belief in the living presence of Jesus in the Eucharist guides us to act accordingly to revere our Lord wholeheartedly. This weekend, I would like to emphasize the tabernacle where the Eucharist is reverently kept and adored.

Tabernacle means "dwelling place", the only place where the Eucharist can be kept for the adoration of the faithful and for the distribution to the sick. It is built solidly and located in the most special place in the Church or in the chapel to facilitate people to come and pray. A lamp or candle is put near the tabernacle to remind us of the Lord's presence. That is why we genuflect when entering the Church or bow down whenever we pass by the tabernacle. We can spend more time in prayer privately to the Blessed Sacrament before or after Mass and during office hours on weekdays.

The Churches and chapels approved by the bishop have permission to house the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle. Therefore, the Eucharist should not be kept inadvertently in any place outside the tabernacle even for a short period of time. If you are commissioned or allowed to bring Holy Communion to people or your loved ones, please follow the following instructions:

- Keep the Eucharist in a metal pyx and reverently carry it around your neck.
- Bring the Blessed Sacrament immediately and directly from the Church to the homebound and loved ones.
- Consume any extra Host right after the service. Contact Sister Mai Do if you would like to have a training to perform this right, honoring our Lord Jesus.



#### **Faith Formation**

Hello Everyone,

This past week, I attended a virtual conference hosted by the Augustine Institute. The title of the gathering was, "The Wisdom of Christ and His Church for the Good of Souls". During one section of the conference the presenter was speaking about the family being the domestic church. It was the second time in as many weeks that I had been reminded of that. You see during a baptismal preparation class I referred to the blessing that the parents often receive at the ritual, and it asks God to bless them as they are the first teachers of their child in the ways of faith. These experiences reminded me that as parents, godparents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, friends, and faith communities, we have the capability and responsibility to strengthen and nurture our family and therefore the domestic church. The USCCB has some simple suggestions on just how to do that;

Pray together as a family.

Have a crucifix in a prominent place in your home, and in every bedroom.

Begin new family traditions that reflect the liturgical seasons. Teach children about charity and stewardship through word and action.

Speak openly about the presence of God in the joys and sorrows of your life.

I believe that most of you are already a living example of how to evangelize within the domestic church, but often our evangelization comes naturally and we don't always recognize it or put a name to it. So as we head into fall and we are spending more time inside together, lets try to intentionally support the domestic church.
