Faith Formation

Hello Everyone,

This week as we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe, we hear in Luke's Gospel, the promise that Jesus makes to the criminal, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise.". With those powerful words we have our final Mass of Year C of our Sunday Liturgical Cycle.

Moved by this celebration, I was thinking about how we experience Scripture within the Mass and I wanted to take a moment and talk a little about our Lectionary. I think we often assume that the Bible and the Lectionary are the same thing, but lets look at what the USCCB says about the difference between the two,

"A Lectionary is composed of the readings and the responsorial psalm assigned for each Mass of the year (Sundays, weekdays, and special occasions). The readings are divided by the day or the theme (baptism, marriage, vocations, etc.) rather than according to the books of the Bible. Introductions and conclusions have been added to each reading. Not all of the Bible is included in the Lectionary."

So what does this mean for us? The Lectionary as we know it, is a result of the Second Vatican Council. It is a three year Sunday cycle of readings that was introduced to provide us with a better knowledge of the whole of God's Word centered on the teachings of three Gospels, Matthew, Mark, and Luke. (These Gospels are referred to as synoptic because they are presented from a similar point of view. The Gospel of John is scattered over each of the other cycles and has a different tone and follows a different order and different accounts than the other Gospels.) The Gospels are supported and enriched by readings from the Old Testament, the Psalms, and the non-Gospel books of the New Testament. All of them woven together to remind us of God's promise, Jesus' mission, and our roles as disciples.

So as we enter into Year A of our Sunday Liturgical Cycle and listen to the words of St. Matthew, it is time to focus on the fullness of God's Word and explore our call to follow. Blessings,
