Don't Marry Too Young
More than two thirds of teenage marriages end in divorce. It's much better wait until you are in your twenties.

Finish School

Wedding Guidelines at St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church

PREPARATION:

1. Diocesan Law requires a minimum preparation time of 6 months. During this time, the couple is encouraged to register and become active members of St. Mary Magdalen.
2. The couple **MUST** meet with the priest before a wedding date can be reserved. If either person has had a previous marriage, **NO DATE** will be set until the Tribunal process has been completed.
3. Preparation will take the couple at least two sessions with the priest for a Pre-Marital Inventory (PMI) exam and other marriage paperwork.
4. Then, the couple is **REQUIRED** to take a Marriage Preparation Program (e.g. Pre-Cana, Engaged Encounter, Sponsor Couple, or Cana II). Inter-faith couple is encouraged to take an ecumenical marriage seminar whenever possible.
5. The couple is to provide recent baptismal certificates (issued within 6 months) and marriage license (acquired at County Clerk Office a month prior to the wedding) to the parish secretary **at least a week before the wedding**.
6. The wedding ceremony may be planned for any day except Sunday, Holy Days, and the days of Holy Week. Weddings are discouraged during Lent. Saturday weddings are no later than 2:00 pm.
7. All parish forms must be turned in no later than one month prior to wedding. The wedding license (with the envelope) and church/music fees must be turned in to the office 10 days prior to the wedding.

FACILITIES:

1. Doors will be unlocked 3 hours prior to the wedding. The bride and bridesmaids may use Room 15 to dress while the groom and groomsmen may go to Rooms 4/5. Please restore those rooms to their original condition after usage.
2. Unity Candles are ok, however, the couple needs to provide their own candles.
3. No aisle runners may be used. Pew bows or any pew decorations are not to be attached by tape or wire. We have special hooks that can be used and returned. No candles on the pews or in the aisles. No decorations can be placed on the aisle floor.
4. The placement and arrangement of flowers must not interfere with the movements of the ceremony. **NO** flowers are to be placed right on the altar. **NO** moving of any liturgical objects of the church is permitted.
5. Photos during the ceremony should not disturb the reverence of the service. **NO** videotaping or photographing from the sanctuary area is permitted. **All photography must be done by 3:00 PM** due to other church services.
6. **NO** throwing of rice, birdseed, confetti, etc. Smoking, drinking and eating are **NOT** allowed in the church due to the sacredness of the setting. **Alcoholic beverages, other mood altering substances, or cigarette smoking, are not permitted on any of the parish property.**
7. The rehearsal is usually 6:00 p.m. on the evening before the wedding. Call the parish office at **(616) 455-9310** if there are other questions.

CEREMONY:
A booklet of Scripture readings and prayers of the faithful is provided to the couple. The couple must choose a gospel, but has the option of picking one or two Scripture readings for the ceremony. Readings/ poetry may NOT replace the Scripture readings. Families and friends are encouraged to take part in reading and serving at the ceremony.

Two witnesses, a man and a woman, who are at least 14 years of age are required.

Marriage between 2 Catholics usually takes place within the context of the Mass. A marriage between a Catholic and a Christian/ non-Christian is often celebrated outside of the Mass for the comfort of the non-Catholic party.

Holy Communion is open ONLY to Catholics.

MUSIC:
All music selected shall be of a sacred nature befitting the church ceremony and must be approved by the parish. Musician fee: \$225.00 ; optional Cantor fee: \$100.00. Please call the music director regarding questions:

CHURCH FEES:
There is a fee of \$150.00 to use the church. This can be paid anytime prior to one week before the ceremony. Any gift to the priest/officiating clergy is welcomed.

Wedding Music

MUSIC IN CATHOLIC WORSHIP
You may be asking yourself: Why do we need music for our wedding? Well, in the catholic church, all liturgical celebrations include music as an active and vital part of the celebration. More importantly, your wedding ceremony should reflect a message of love, not only human love, but the love shared between you and God. What better way to help achieve this than through the gift of music? What lies ahead are guidelines and suggestions to help you through the selection process. Please read carefully, ask any questions you may have and enjoy as you prepare for your special celebration.

RECOMMENDATIONS
First and foremost, take some time to pray and reflect as you prepare for this great sacrament of marriage. Think about what you want to “say” through the music you select. It is strongly recommended that you avoid music selection that would imply a concert or performance atmosphere during your celebration. Good and sound Catholic Liturgy *involves* the congregation; help make your guests a part of what’s happening in the sacrament

Secular music is strictly prohibited within Catholic Liturgy. What does that mean? Well, simply put, music

that lacks *liturgical or religious substance* would not be allowed. For example, think of your favorite “love song” that you have heard on the radio. Even though that some may be special to you and speaks of the human love you share with each other, chances are it would not hold any liturgical or religious substance and therefore it would not be appropriate during your celebration. Those special songs are best included during the reception or party after the church ceremony. The *Director of Music Ministries* will preview any music or songs that you have in mind and evaluate them for liturgical appropriateness.

Special guest musicians, family and friends are always welcomed and encouraged to help with your music. Again, the *Director of Music Ministries* will help you facilitate anyone outside of St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church to help provide music.

STIPENDS FOR MUSICIANS
A stipend is a monetary amount given to a musician to compensate them for their time, talent and professional service. The *Director of Music Ministries* monitors all stipends for musicians provided by St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church. If you have musicians outside of the

church provide your music (whether they are family or close friends) a stipend is generally expected from you. The following suggestions are for your consideration and information regarding musicians brought in by us to service your wedding.

Organist/Pianist.....\$200.00
Cantor/Soloist.....\$100.00
Instrumentalist ...see music director

It is the policy of St. Mary Magdalen Catholic Church that all stipends for musicians be paid to the parish office one week prior to the wedding taking place. Checks can be post-dated for the wedding day, but the parish secretary should receive all stipends prior to the wedding. Checks should be made out to the individual musician unless otherwise noted.

This was the first of the sign given by Jesus; it was given at Cana in Galilee.

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had likewise been invited to the celebration. At a certain point the wine ran out, and Jesus’ mother told him, “They have no more wine.” Jesus replied, “Woman, how does this concern of yours involve me? My hour has not yet come.” His mother instructed those waiting on table, “Do whatever he tells you.” As prescribed for Jewish ceremonial washings, there were at hand six stone water jars, each one holding fifteen to twenty-five gallons. “Fill those jars with water,” Jesus ordered, at which they filled them to the brim. “Now,” he said, “draw some out and take it to the waiter in charge.” They did as he instructed them. The waiter in charge tasted the water made wine, without knowing where it had come from; only the waiters knew, since they had drawn the water. Then the waiter in charge called the groom over and remarked to him:

Then Rebekah and her maids started out; they mounted their camels and followed the man. So the servant took Rebekah and went on his way.
Meanwhile Isaac had gone for Beer-lahairoi and was living in the region of the Negeb. One day toward evening he went out . . . in the field, and as he looked around, he noticed that camels were approaching. They have only to observe the reverent purity of your way of life. The affectation of an elaborate hairdress, the wearing of golden jewelry, or the donning of rich robes is not for you. Your adornment is rather the hidden character of the heart, expressed in the unfading beauty of the heart, expressed in the unfading beauty of a calm and gentle disposition. This is precious in God’s eyes. The holy women of past ages used to adorn themselves in this way, reliant on God and obedient to their husbands – for example, Sarah, who was subject to Abraham and called him her master. You are her children when you do what is right and let no fears alarm you.

You husbands, too, must show consideration for those who share your lives. Treat women with respect as the weaker sex, heirs just as much as you to the gracious gift of life. If you do so, nothing will keep your prayers from being answered.

In summary, then, all of you should be likeminded, sympathetic, loving toward one another, kindly disposed, and humble. Do not return evil for evil or insult for insult. Return a blessing instead. This you have been called to do, that you may receive a blessing as your inheritance.

There is no limit to love’s forbearance, to its trust, its hope, its power to endure. Love never fails.

This mystery has many implications, and I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

Follow the way of love, even as Christ loved you. He gave himself for us.

Defer to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Wives should be submissive to their husbands as if to the Lord because the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of his body the church, as well as its savior. As the church submits to Christ, so wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church. He gave himself up for her to make her holy, purifying her in the bath of water by the power of the word, to present to himself a glorious church, holy and immaculate, without stain or wrinkle or anything of that sort. Husbands should love their wives as they do their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. Observe that no one ever hates his own flesh; no, he nourishes it and takes care of it as Christ cares for the church – for we are members of his body.

“For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother,
and shall cling to his wife,
and the two shall be made into one.”

This is a great foreshadowing; I mean that it refers to Christ and the church. In any case, each one should love his wife as he loves himself, the wife for her part showing respect for her husband.
