## Family Car Talk

In today's Gospel, Jesus sees how much people need help, healing, and hope. Instead of trying to do everything alone, he chooses the twelve apostles and sends them out together. The apostles are not perfect, but Jesus trusts them and gives them a mission. God still works this way today! He is always calling people, forming them, and sending them to help others.

As you go home, talk about what it means to be chosen and sent by Jesus.

**A Advanced:** How does being sent by Jesus change how the apostles live?
